In the absence of nutrition guidelines specifically for patients receiving ECMO, it appears reasonable to follow currently available guidelines for general critically unwell patients that recommend IC where available or weight-based equations ranging from 20 to 25 kcal/kg. 23. 24 European Society for Parenteral and Enteral Nutrition guidelines 24 go on to further recommend 25-30 kcal/kg when the patient has moved into the recovery phase of critical illness.

Nutrition Support in Adult Patients Receiving ...

200-300 mg daily, vitamin B co strong 1 or 2 tablets, three times a day (or full dose. daily intravenous vitamin B preparation, if necessary) and a balanced multivitamin/. trace element supplement once daily. These guidelines cover most aspects of nutrition supportin adult patients (>18 years) who are either malnourished or are at 'risk' of malnutrition. In some cases specific guidance related to patients in specific care settings or with specific diseases has been provided but in general the guidance is applicable to patients whatever their setting (hospital or community) or disease.
